Scholarship Requirements

- Student must demonstrate academic excellence
 - Applying student must have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - Strong science or animal-related activities
- Plans to pursue a career in veterinary medicine
- Applying student must have:
 - Experience working in a veterinary clinic or riding with a large animal veterinarian
 - Provide an essay describing interest in community service & volunteerism related to the welfare of animals such as local animal shelters, humane society, equine rescue organizations, etc
 - Provide a diary or log of activities participated in
- 2 letters of recommendation
 - From a non-related teacher or guidance counselor
 - From a veterinarian with whom the applicant has worked or volunteered

DEADLINE:

APRIL 1

Eligibility

- Applicant must be admitted to St. Andrews University
- Applicant must have paid the \$250 Enrollment Deposit to Admissions at St. Andrews
- Applicant must file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form or submit a letter indicating that you have no financial need. The FAFSA form is online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The St. Andrews school code is **001540**.
