Special Studies and Topics Courses Fall 2022

ENG 280 Topics in Pop Culture: Banned Books

This course will offer students a broad overview of literary writing that has proven controversial. While engaging with such "dangerous" texts, students will encounter ideas and perspectives —many of which come from marginalized communities—that will enhance their understanding of the world around them and their place within it. Throughout the semester, students will consider the motives behind suppression efforts, the impact of censorship, the ethics of book banning, and even the extent to which discomfort is a key component of literature.

ENG 290/390 Gothic Horror

Since its emergence from the revolutionary turmoil and artistic upheavals of the Romantic era, the literary aesthetic of the gothic has been used to grapple with wrenching social and political changes and their attendant anxieties. By probing such fears and unease, however, Gothic writing also played an important role in exploring the depths and complexity of the human mind at a time of gathering interest in, and significant philosophical speculation about, the workings of the innermost self. In this course, we will consider how Gothic Horror merges an historical sensibility with psychological insight to examine matters such as the persistence of the past, collective trauma, moral and social transgressions, the individual and their relation to society, and the forging of identity. Tracing the evolution of Gothic conventions from the eighteenth century to their deployment in present day literature and film, we will study poetry, fiction, and movies in their social and cultural contexts, develop a greater appreciation for the history and resonance of human culture, and practice critical analysis in class discussions and written assignments. Reading selections may include short stories, novels, and poetry from authors such as John Keats, Samuel Taylor Coleridge, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Elizabeth Gaskell, Oscar Wilde, William Faulkner, Flannery O'Connor, Jesmyn Ward, and Silvia Moreno-Garcia. Film selections may include *Crimson Peak, Let the Right One In, His House,* and *Blood Quantum*.

EDU 390/490 Behavioral Disorders and Advanced Classroom Management

This course is designed to provide prospective Special Education teacher candidates a comprehensive study in Behavioral Disorders and the specialized classroom-behavior management for students with various disabilities. The pre-service teachers will dig deeper in specific behavior trends for individual disabilities. Candidates will learn about the best behavior modification methods to use when working with students with Behavioral Disorders. Candidates will design and present a comprehensive behavior prevention system and behavior management system that employs the most recent research.

Special Conditions: Admission to the Education Department; completed EDU 344 Classroom Management

HIS 214A/314A Topics in American History: Black Reconstruction: The Unfinished Revolution

Witness the efforts of the first free African Americans after the Civil War as they sought to define the contours of their liberty. Review the events of the Civil War and the United States' failure of democracy. Experience the triumphs of eight years where integration and shared governance worked. Scrutinize the terrorism of the Democratic party's violent and illegitimate reclamation of power through the rising force of white supremacy. This course invites interested student of any experience and all backgrounds to engage with this most important part of U.S. history. We will read, discuss, debate, and write our ideas throughout the semester.

HIS 214B Topics in American History: The New South

The "New South" began with the transition from slavery to freedom for African Americans and from rebels to vanquished for many European American southerners. Ravaged by war, wracked by poverty, how would the South recover? Discovering the causes of the South's deep poverty and institutionalized injustice may objectify Southern lives as no more than the problems they faced, but we will do more than this. We will both observe regional forces and daily life, instability and long held custom, fluid growth and stagnation. Follow Southerners as they seek to make a way out of no way. Students will read, write, and discuss the history of the New South that ranges from the late 19th to the early 20th centuries.

HIS 215B/315B Topics in European History: The Might of Ancient Rome

This course will trace the outlines of Roman history from 800 BC to AD 600, from monarchy to republic and back to monarchy, paying particular attention to the Romans' own surviving words, buildings, and objects. Social history and 'how the Romans lived' are given equal focus. Consideration of how the Romans and their history have been interpreted and used up to modern times will challenge students to recognize the importance of perspective in history while giving them a deeper appreciation for what ancient Roman culture has contributed, for better or worse, to our modern world. Students will engage primary and secondary sources, literary, and archaeological evidence.

HIS 215A/315A Topics in European History: Calling Bulls**t

This course will cover different aspects of fake news and propaganda in diverse Western historical settings by examining news, data, and social media. A major focus will be applying critical thinking to rhetoric and issues in the social and natural sciences including ancient and modern, political, and popular. Students will practice finding nonsensical claims and evaluating what exactly makes them suspect, including language, statistical figures, targeted populations, and forms of propaganda intended to persuade with a subtle or blatant misrepresentation of truth and comprehensive whole.

PHI290 Topics in Philosophy: Pragmatism: The American Philosophical Tradition

Americans have always been pragmatic in their approach to life. This course will examine philosophers who embodied this American approach to life in their philosophy, including Charles Sanders Pierce, William James, Josiah Royce, John Dewey, George Herbert Mead, and W.E.B. Dubois. It

will look at fundamental questions of truth and relativism, religion and values, democracy and education, and race and social change through the lens of this distinctively American philosophical tradition.
